

# Lums Pond State Park

## 2011-12 Hunting Rules

### Archery and Shotgun

*Refer to attached map for approximate locations of indicated areas.*

1. In addition to the rules and regulations found in the “Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide: 2011-2012”, specific rules that apply to Lums Pond State Park are listed below. **All hunters must register at Lums Pond State Park hunting prior to hunting in the park.** There is an annual \$10 hunting registration fee charge. This fee is waived for hunters 65 or over. If you intend to hunt at Lums Pond, hunters must register, in person, at the park office. A valid 2011/2012 Delaware hunting license is required to register. **NOTE:** Once obtained, this registration will be valid for hunters participating in the Delaware State Park Hunting Program at any Delaware State Park that has hunting. **However, it is the hunter’s responsibility to become familiar with each park’s specific rules and regulations.**
2. **Hunting with any firearm is prohibited until the November shotgun season.**
3. **Archery hunting is prohibited until October 17, 2011.**
4. **There is no dove or waterfowl hunting at Lums Pond State Park.**
5. **There will be no small game seasons for the 2011-2012 seasons at Lums Pond State Park.**
6. **There is no early (October) muzzleloader or shotgun seasons, January handgun season, or January muzzleloader season at Lums Pond State Park.**
7. **Handguns are strictly prohibited and may not be possessed or used at Lums Pond State Park.**
8. **Deer Hunting – Archery/Crossbow Season**  
Permitted, in season, in Zones A, B, C, D, W, X, Y, and Z, from October 17, 2011 to January 28, 2012. Within Zone Z, four stands are available on a first-come, first-serve basis for hunter safety and convenience. Use of these stands is not mandatory. Only archery/crossbow hunting is permitted in Zones W, X, Y, and Z.

During archery/crossbow seasons, hunting is prohibited within 50 yards of any park trail due to increased visitor usage throughout the park. As rule of thumb, hunters should not be visible from trails.

9. **Deer Hunting—Shotgun Season**  
Permitted, in season, in Zones A, B, C, and D. Shotgun seasons are as follows:  
November 11<sup>th</sup> until November 19<sup>nd</sup> 2011  
December 10<sup>th</sup> until December 17<sup>th</sup> 2011 (Antlerless)  
January 14<sup>th</sup> until January 21<sup>th</sup> 2012

11. **Hunters (both archery/crossbow and shotgun) must register at the tag board in the R. C. Field. All hunters are required to sign out a tag for the area he/she will be hunting in, before entering the hunting area. The tag must be displayed on the dashboard of the hunter's vehicle. Tags must be returned and the hunter must sign out when the hunter leaves their hunting area for any reason. Tags may not be removed from the board until 5:00 AM daily. Failure to comply with these rules will result in revocation of park hunting privileges.**
12. Hunting or shooting from Lums Pond or over the pond is strictly prohibited.
13. During shotgun seasons hunting is prohibited within 15 yards of any park trail. While trails are closed during all shotgun deer seasons, other park users sometimes enter upon the trails. **Be aware of your target and what is beyond it.**
14. It is illegal to use or build a nailed or permanent tree stand or ladder. Portable stands must be of a type that will not damage trees. Unattended stands will be confiscated.
15. The clearing/cutting of vegetation to form shooting lanes or for any other purpose is prohibited. Tying ribbon or placing of reflective tacks (hot dots) on trees is prohibited.
16. The possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages or drugs are strictly prohibited.

The main park entrance gate on Howell School Road opens at 8:00 a.m. and closes at sunset. Dependent upon ongoing construction, weather, or other factors, one or more areas may be closed. **MESSAGE TO ALL HUNTERS:**

- Please be careful, discrete and considerate around other park visitors. Understand that many park patrons are NOT hunters and some may feel threatened by your presence.
- Deer remain in moderate numbers in the park. By hunting in Lums Pond, you are a vital part of our “deer management team”. In fact, significant deer damage is still apparent in many palatable plant species within the park.
- Proper management of Lums’ deer herd is simple: we must harvest more does and let more yearling and button bucks walk away to balance the herd’s sex ratio and increase the number of males. Make a proper management decision before you shoot.
- Have a safe and successful hunt.
