- Climbing and rappelling are restricted to regular park hours and to approved locations using Division approved and installed anchors.
- This registration and photo identification must be in your possession while climbing.
- The Division does not certify climbers. Each person is encouraged to be in good physical condition and have all necessary equipment in good repair and receive appropriate training before attempting this activity.
- The installation, adjustment, or maintenance of any fixed hardware not specifically authorized by the Division is prohibited. Report hardware problems to the park office – (302) 577-7020.
- A designated parking lot for the rock climbing area is located in the Delaware State Parks parking area on the opposite side of the Brandywine River.
- Youth under age 18 must have adult supervision.
