

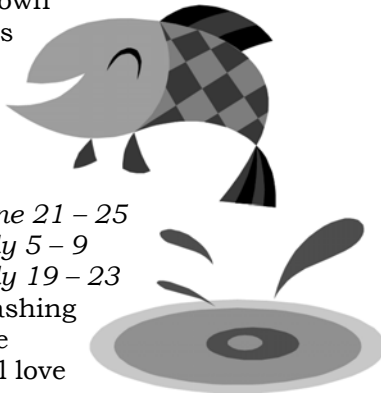
Half-Day Nature Camps

Session 3: July 12 – 16

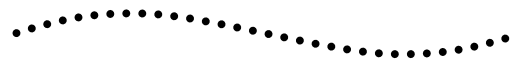

White Clay Creek State Park full-day camps run from 8:30 am to 3:30 pm. Campers should bring a backpack, change of clothes, snack, lunch, filled water bottle and water shoes. Space is limited, so advanced registration is recommended. Some camps may include within-park travel or field trips; parents will be notified in advance.

Stream Explorers: Animal Tales

August 2 – 6

For campers completing grades 2, 3 and 4

Cost: \$175

Try a little bit of everything at this one-of-a-kind fun-filled camp! Kids will explore the woods, wade in the creek, play games, have a cook-out and use their imaginations to create amazing art and kid-friendly habitats outside.



Wilderness Adventure Rangers

July 26 – 30

For campers completing grades 3, 4 and 5

Cost: \$175

This is an exciting week of adventure in the park as we creep out into the wilderness! We will also meet guests who will teach us about wildlife rescue, enforcement and wilderness safety.

Working With Animals

Level 1: July 12 – 16

For campers completing grades 2 and 3

Level 2: August 9 – 13

For campers completing grades 4 and 5

Cost: \$195

Do you love animals? Think you may want to work with them some day? If so, you will want to attend this camp where you will meet animals and people with different careers that relate to animals! We will also participate in a service project with a local animal rescue organization.



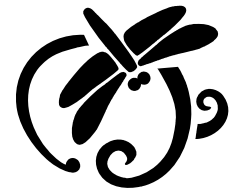
Aftercare is available for full-day nature camps only.

Cost: \$35 per week, per camper

Campers should bring an additional aftercare snack. If a minimum of 3 campers are not enrolled at least 2 weeks before camp, we reserve the right to cancel for that week.



Registration

Opens Monday, February 8

Forms are available for download at www.destateparks.com, or may be obtained from the park. Campers are not guaranteed placement in camp until all forms and payment are received. Call (302) 368-6900 to register. Payment may be mailed in the form of a check or made by phone using Visa, MasterCard or Discover. If cancellation is received at least 30 days before the start of camp, a full refund will be issued (less a \$30 administrative fee). Refunds will not be issued after the 30-day cutoff date.

Counselor in Training Opportunities

If you are 14 or older and interested in becoming a summer camp counselor, please ask about CIT opportunities at White Clay Creek State Park! As a CIT you will receive training and first-hand experience on how to work with kids of various ages. You will also grow as an individual as you take on responsibilities and contribute your own ideas to camp activities! A CIT is a volunteer position and a minimum of assisting with 2 full camps is required (half day or full day depending on the individual).
