illens Pond State Park has a lot to offer birdwatchers. A musaic of upland forest, forested wetlands, meadows, freshwater marsh and a 75-acre millpond provide habitat for a diverse collection of resident and migratory birds. And all are easily accessible from several hiking trails and by kayak or canoe.

In winter, the pond attracts a variety of waterfowl including Snow Geese, Great Blue Herons and other waterbirds. The forested wetlands, especially along the Murderkill River above and below the pond, provide habitat for Barred Owl year-round and Wood Ducks and Prothonotary Warblers during the breeding season. The meadows and forest edges attract a variety of sparrows and other songbirds. On calm evenings in late winter and early spring, male Woodcocks perform their aerial displays.

Your sightings are crucial to helping us better understand the abundance and occurrence of birds at Killens Pond State Park. Please report unusual sightings to the park naturalist. This list is based on the Seventh Edition of the American Ornithological Union's Checklist of North American Birds. The brochure is most helpful when used in conjunction with the National Geographic Guide to the Birds of North America, the Kauffman Guide to Birds of North America, or a Field Guide to the Birds of Eastern and Central North America, by Roger Tory Peterson.
